
# James 2:1-10, [11-13], 14-17


My brothers and sisters, do you with your acts of favoritism really believe in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ? For if a person with gold rings and in fine clothes comes into your assembly, and if a poor person in dirty clothes also comes in, and if you take notice of the one wearing the fine clothes and say, "Have a seat here, please," while to the one who is poor you say, "Stand there," or, "Sit at my feet," have you not made distinctions among yourselves, and become judges with evil thoughts? Listen, my beloved brothers and sisters.

Has not God chosen the poor in the world to be rich in faith and to be heirs of the kingdom that he has promised to those who love him? But you have dishonored the poor. Is it not the rich who oppress you? Is it not they who drag you into court? Is it not they who blaspheme the excellent name that was invoked over you? You do well if you really fulfill the royal law according to the scripture, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." But if you show partiality, you commit sin and are convicted by the law as transgressors. For whoever keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become accountable for all of it. [ For the one who said, "You shall not commit adultery," also said, "You shall not murder." Now if you do not commit adultery but if you murder, you have become a transgressor of the law. So speak and so act as those who are to be judged by the law of liberty. For judgment will be without mercy to anyone who has shown no mercy; mercy triumphs over judgment.] What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but do not have works? Can faith save you? If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food, and one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill," and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that? So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead.

Priest The holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark. People Glory to you, Lord Christ.

#### Mark 7:24-37

Jesus set out and went away to the region of Tyre. He entered a house and did not want anyone to know he was there. Yet he could not escape notice, but a woman whose little daughter had an unclean spirit immediately heard about him, and she came and bowed down at his feet. Now the woman was a Gentile, of Syrophoenician origin. She begged him to cast the demon out of her daughter. He said to her. "Let the children be fed first, for it is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs." But she answered him, "Sir, even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs." Then he said to her, "For saying that, you may go—the demon has left your daughter." So she went home, found the child lying on the bed, and the demon gone. Then he returned from the region of Tyre, and went by way of Sidon towards the Sea of Galilee, in the region of the Decapolis. They brought to him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they begged him to lay his hand on him. He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, and put his fingers into his ears, and he spat and touched his tongue. Then looking up to heaven, he sighed and said to him, "Ephphatha," that is, "Be opened." And immediately his ears were opened, his tongue was released, and he spoke plainly. Then Jesus ordered them to tell no one; but the more he ordered them, the more zealously they proclaimed it. They were astounded beyond measure, saying, "He has done everything well; he even makes the deaf to hear and the mute to speak."







We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

At the following words concerning the bread, the Celebrant is to hold it or lay a hand upon it; and at the words concerning the cup, to hold or place a hand upon the cup and any other vessel containing wine to be consecrated.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." Therefore, according to his command, O Father.

And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with [\_\_\_\_\_\_ and] all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Members Absent: Betty Westrop, Duane Himes, & Deacon Dan Maxwell. Ellen called the meeting to order at 6:00pm and Cathy Meske led the Vestry in prayer.

**Vestry Meeting Minutes** – approved Lisa moved, Jim supported. Motion passed.

**CLERK'S REPORT: FINANCE - Financial Report**: July 2024 - Vestry spent time reviewing the financials. Year to date, we are above budget with income slightly higher due to a variety of reasons (no priest salary, increased giving and some growth with membership). We are \$9,000 ahead of where we were last year. Don moved to accept the financial report, Lisa supported. Questions were asked about looking for a renter for the rectory and expanding marketing for the rental.

**NEW BUSINESS: Little Girls Tea** - July 2024 - Sue Krafft and Bronwyn Woolman presented that 20 years ago the Tea was started with 6 girls organized by Maggie Michaud. Last time it was done in 2022 and the Tea hosted 50 girls. This year they would like to have the tea on Saturday, December 7, 2024. Time to be determined. It was agreed that the event will be called the Children's Advent Tea. There is \$322 in the budget for the Tea.

**2023 Financial Review -** Vestry reviewed the financial audit and it will be filled with the minutes. The financial review included a checklist and recommendations. This was reviewed by the Vestry. One idea brought forward by the reviewers was to add a Planned Gift program to help provide a stronger financial base. Discussion took place about having the Stewardship Committee add this to their campaign.

**Chimney Repair, Rectory** - Don Stockdale - Discussion surrounding the financing of the Chimney Repair. Vestry was asked to approve the move of \$3,900 from Rosella Scott Bequest line into the Rectory Repair Fund to cover the balance of \$8,900 invoice. Diosesan Grant will cover \$5,000. Cathy Meske moved, Lisa Rhea supported. Motion passed.

**OLD BUSINESS: SENIOR WARDEN'S -** A food drive for Sunday Supper and extra food supplies is being done by LaFarge/Holcim.

The Stewardship Committee is formed and will spend time preparing the Stewardship Campaign for 2025.

Cleaning Crew discussion continued from last month about talking to the company. Don has agreed to take this on.

#### **REPORT BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS** – Junior Warden

Don gave an update on maintenance needed on the limestone. Vestry is looking at ensuring that water intrusion does not continue as it compromises the limestone. Maintenance has not been regularly done on the limestone. Discussion about a list of possible maintenance needs within the church that Don has created. Don will prioritize the project list. Maintenance of the building needs to be built into the budget.

**OTHER BUSINESS** - Discussion about the communion wine. This past week it was a blend of older wine. Discussion of cost and supply of port for communion wine.

Welcome to Trinity, part of the Anglican Communion, and thus, both catholic and reformed — the *via media* or "middle way" between Roman Catholicism and Protestantism.

Trinity organized in 1864 and our Victorian Gothic building dates from 1883. As a "National Jubilee Center," we reach out to many in need, and as a venue for performing arts, we live out our identity as a "village church" in the English tradition.
