Marion Madeline Cadarette, 52, of Alpena passed away unexpectedly at her home on Saturday, January 11, 2025, of an apparent heart attack.



Marion was born in Alpena on August 27, 1972, to Henry and Carolyn (Gilbert) Cadarette. Marion will be remembered as outgoing, loving, slow to find fault and the family peacemaker for everyone. Her talent was shown from the time she was a child when at a very young age she stepped forward to starting her life as an entertainer. Along the way she was a caregiver not only to her families' children but as a nanny to other's children. She loved music and her friendships span a life of giving her talent. She was co-owner of the Maplewood Tavern, moving back to Alpena after her long fruitful life in Arizona, to help her grandmother Clarise and her dad, Henry, run the family business. During her years in Arizona, she and her mother made their niche in Bluegrass music. She was the artist on several recordings as a solo vocal artist, lending her harmony voice to many more recordings in several genres. Marion made time to support causes that were important to her. She loved and cared for abused and neglected animals, supported adoption from shelters. She took time to entertain at senior living homes. She supported her musician friends. Marion was one of a kind, when God gave her to us, she didn't come with a calendar. Her life on earth was short, but our love and memories of her will last forever.

Surviving are her mother, Carolyn (Joseph) Szatkowski, sisters, Melissa (Pat) Gapske, Carah (Jeff) Pohl; nieces and nephews, Josh (Chelsea) Gapske, Carise (Matthew) Babcock, Monica Fras, Marissa Pohl; 3 great nieces and nephews, Grace, Carson, Grady; aunts, cousins, numerous other family and friends.

Priest God of earth and sky and sea, all things are born of your love and what you make is yours forever. The mountains are yours, and none of their ravines can threaten us. The rivers and seas are yours, and none of their waters can overwhelm us. You give us rest in green pastures and lead us beside still waters.

Seduced by distraction, we wander far from the safe paths you set for us. Our selfishness takes us away from you and all our ways lead to estrangement and anxiety. Again and again you call us to return to you, to remember our mission in your Name.

In the holy words of righteous men and women in every age you speak your unchanging Word of love and mercy. And in the fullness of time you sent your Son, born of a woman, to be our Brother Savior: to seek and find those who are lost, to comfort and renew those who are afraid, to strengthen and uphold those who are weak and to gather us all into the safe embrace of your love.

Through Jesus Christ our Lord; who rose victorious from the dead, and comforts us with the blessed hope of everlasting life. For to your faithful people, O Lord, life is changed, not ended; and when our mortal body lies in death, there is prepared for us a dwelling place eternal in the heavens.

Therefore we praise you, joining with the heavenly chorus, with prophets, apostles, and martyrs, and with all those in every generation who have heard your voice and answered your call, to proclaim with them your glory, in their unending hymn:

Then the Priest continues

From the table of your bountiful provision we bring before you these gifts of bread and wine, fruits of the earth and the labor of our hands.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ our Lord.

In answer to your call, We bring ourselves before you, body, soul and spirit. Let your Holy Spirit come upon us also that we may continue in your love, faithfully follow where you lead, and live together in constancy and peace.

On the night of his betrayal your only Begotten and our brother Jesus Christ, took bread, said the blessing, broke the bread, and gave it to his friends, and said, *“Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.”*

After supper, he took the cup of wine, gave thanks, and said, *“Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me.”*

And so, remembering all that was done for us: the cross, the tomb, the resurrection and ascension, and offering to you our gifts of bread and wine we acclaim your Christ:

Let your Spirit awaken in us your gifts for ministry. Let your Spirit guide and direct us in their use. Let your Spirit indwelling in us fill us with the courage we will need to pursue our mission in your Name.

In this feast we receive again the grace of your goodness and mercy which follows us all our days and here we have a foretaste of the life which is ours when we dwell in your house forever.

Accept our prayers and praises, Loving God, through Jesus Christ, the author of our salvation and the captain of our mission and ministry. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, now and forever. **Amen.**
