


Wisdom of Solomon 3:1-9

THANK YOU

A big "thank you!" is due the generous people of Trinity Episcopal Church, who having learned of a need in the community, stepped up to meet it! In a conversation with Alpena Public Schools School Success workers, members of TECW heard about a newly-arrived family of four – mom, baby, and two school-age children – who only had beds for the mom and baby. The schoolchildren were sleeping on chairs in the living room. TECW went to work seeking bids, voting to allocate monies, and asking the congregation for additional bedding supplies, and in a matter of weeks the good deed was done. Young's Appliance offered two twin beds for \$400 each, supplementing that with free pillows and two free sets of sheets, and delivered the furniture. TECW agreed to pay the bill, and In only a few days the congregation added in extra sheets, cushions, blankets, and comforters for all the beds, mom's included. We are grateful to Young's Appliance for their benevolent assistance and to all the parish. Our people continually show what it means to "walk in love."
